Reed Lebster's Big Night Leads Grizzlies to Victory

Reed Lebster scored 3 goals and 1 assist in a Grizzlies 5-0 win at Idaho. It was Utah's first hat trick since Neil Shea scored three goals vs Tahoe on December 21, 2024. The four point effort for Lebster tied a career high as he scored 2 goals and 2 assists at Tulsa on March 1, 2025 in a game Utah won 8-3. Lebster had 19 goals and 27 assists for Utah in the 2024-25 season.

Dylan Wells 46 Save Shutout

Dylan Wells stopped all 46 shots for Utah at Idaho on October 24, 2025. It was his fourth professional shutout. He had 2 clean sheets in the AHL and now has 2 in the ECHL. The last Grizzlies shutout by a goaltender was on December 31, 2023 when Dante Gianuzzi stopped all 32 Tulsa shots in a Utah 1-0 win.

Tyler Gratton Named Grizzlies Captain, Shea, Manning, Ganske and Berg to Wear "A's"

Tyler Gratton is the new Utah Grizzlies captain. Gratton scored his first goal in a Utah uniform in the first period of a 5-0 victory at Idaho on October 24. Gratton is in his second season as a professional. He scored 20 goals for the Reading Royals in the 2024-25 campaign, which led the club. Gratton was the captain of the Arizona State University team in the 2023-24 season.

Luke Manning and Neil Shea each had the "A's" on their sweaters for the October 24th game at Idaho. Adam Berg and Noah Ganske will also wear letters for Utah this season.

Hansen-Bukata, the Assists Machine

Aiden Hansen-Bukata had 3 assists in his pro debut at Idaho on October 24. He has racked up a bunch of assists over the last few years. He led Ohio State University with 29 assists during the 2024-25 season. He also had a couple of big assists totals at R.I.T (Rochester Institute of Technology) as he had 26 assists and led the team in plus/minus (+23) in 37 games during the 2023-24 season. He had 30 assists and was a +19 in 37 games during the 2022-23 season.

Charle-Edouard D'Astous Called Up to NHL's Tampa Bay Lightning

Defenseman Charle-Edouard D'Astous was called up to the NHL's Tampa Bay Lightning on October 20th. D'Astous was the 2021-2022 ECHL Defenseman of the Year while playing with Utah. D'Astous had 26 goals, 31 assists and a +21 rating in 52 regular season games in the 2021-22 campaign but it was his legendary playoff performance that cemented his legacy as one of the greatest defensemen in team history. He broke a league single season playoff record with 19 goals. He also broke the record for power play goals in a single playoff year with 11.

D'Astous is the third player from the 2021-22 Grizzlies Mountain Division Championship club to get called up to the NHL. Avalanche goaltender Trent Miner was with Utah for three seasons from 2021-2024. Defenseman Nate Clurman played in one game last season with the Pittsburgh Penguins.

John Becanic's First Win as a Pro Head Coach

New Grizzlies head coach John Becanic earned his first professional win with Utah's 3-1 victory at Greenville on Friday night. Becanic is the ninth head coach in team history. Grizzlies coaches are now 6-2-0-1 in their debut games.

Both Goaltenders Have Looked Sharp

Dryden McKay has a .923 save percentage in 2 starts this season. McKay won his first Grizzlies start as he saved 25 of 26 at Greenville on October 17. **Dylan Wells** has saved 79 of 82 through two games with Utah, including a 46 save shutout on October 24, 2025. Both goaltenders have great resumes. McKay holds the NCAA record for career shutouts with 34. He had three consecutive seasons with exactly 10 shutouts. McKay won the 2022 Hobey Baker Award, which is annually given to the best NCAA hockey player. He was just the third goaltender to receive the award. McKay holds the record for the most wins in NCAA history with 113. The next closest goalie has 89. He also holds the NCAA record for wins in a single season with 38, which was set in his 2021-22 senior season. McKay played for the ECHL's Newfoundland Growlers for two seasons, appearing in 68 games and registering a record of 27-26-8 with three shutouts.

Wells brings 8 years of professional experience as he has played with 5 AHL teams and 4 other ECHL clubs. Wells has an AHL contract with the Tucson Roadrunners. Wells appeared in one NHL game, which came on November 5, 2022 for the Chicago Blackhawks as he played in the third period of a 4-0 loss. Wells saved 12 of 13 that night.

Player Notes

Danny Dzhaniyev scored his first professional point with an assist on October 18 at Atlanta.

Christian Felton scored his first professional goal on October 19 at Atlanta.

Tyler Gratto scored his first goal with Utah 2:42 into the first period on October 24. Gratto has a current two game point streak. Gratto was named captain of the Grizzlies on October 24.

Aiden Hansen-Bukata had 3 assists in his Grizzlies debut on October 24.

Reed Lebster leads Utah with a +5 rating. Lebster tied a career high with a 4 point game (3g, 1a) at Idaho on October 24. It was his first professional hat trick.

Dryden McKay has a .923 save percentage through 2 games this season.

Griffin Ness got his first point of the season with an assist in Utah's 5-0 win on October 24.

Garrett Pyke scored two goals and was a +3 in Utah's 3-1 win at Greenville on October 17.

Jack Ricketts scored his first professional goal 7:11 into the second period on October 18 at Atlanta. Ricketts has a goal in 2 of his last 3 games.

Ty Voit has a goal in two of his four games this season.

Dylan Wells saved all 46 shots in a 5-0 victory at Idaho on October 24. Wells has saved 79 of 82 through two starts with Utah.

Team Notes

Head coach John Becanic won his first professional game on October 17, 2025 at Greenville. Utah is outscoring opponents 2 to 1 in the first periods of games this season. Utah's home opener is on Saturday, October 25, 2025 at 7:10 pm. Utah is averaging 7.50 penalty minutes per game this season (30 minutes in 4 games). Utah's penalty kill

was a perfect 8 for 8 on October 24 at Idaho and is 11 for 12 so far on the season. Utah is outscoring opponents 4 to 1 in the first periods. Utah has a 4 to 3 advantage in the second periods.

2025-2026 Utah Grizzlies – The Final Hunt

On September 9, 2025 the ECHL Board of Governors has approved the Transfer of the Controlling Interest in the Utah Grizzlies' Membership from Grizzlies Hockey Club, LLC to Pro Hockey Partners, LLC, who will relocate the team to Trenton, NJ, at the conclusion of the 2025-26 season.

For 30 years, the Utah Grizzlies have been an integral part of the local sports landscape, creating countless moments of joy and excitement. The organization extends a heartfelt and profound thank you to the dedicated fans who have filled the stands, to the members of the booster club who have provided a sense of home to our players and coaches, and to the community partners who have supported the team through every season.

In Memoriam: Kevin Bruder (1968-2025)

Kevin Bruder, beloved General Manager of the Maverik Center, President & CEO of the Utah Grizzlies, and Chairman of the ECHL Board of Governors, passed away on May 11 at the age of 56, while enjoying the Utah outdoors. Kevin's greatest joy was his family, and he is survived by Susan and their four beloved children: Allison, Emily, Joel, and Christopher.

Kevin and his family moved to Utah in 1997 as the Maverik Center—then known as The E-Center—prepared to open its doors and take the international stage as a host venue for ice hockey during the 2002 Winter Olympic Games. Named by the Elmore Sports Group as the arena's first General Manager, Kevin went on to hold that role for nearly three decades, shaping the Maverik Center into a cornerstone of sports and entertainment in the region. In 2005, Kevin was named President & CEO of the Utah Grizzlies, and in 2021, his peers throughout the league elected him Chairman of the ECHL Board of Governors—an honor that spoke to the high regard in which he was held across professional hockey.

A tireless advocate for the power of sports and community, Kevin gave generously of his time and talents, volunteering for organizations including Make-A-Wish Utah, Visit Salt Lake, TEAM Coalition, IAVM and dozens more over nearly 30 years. His commitment to civic engagement was matched only by his leadership within the Maverik Center and the Grizzlies organization.

Kevin Bruder's legacy is one of leadership, generosity, and service. He leaves behind a community that was stronger because of him, and he will be deeply missed by all who had the privilege of knowing or working alongside him.

Returning Grizzlies for the 2025-26 Final Hunt

There are 10 players with previous Grizzlies experience. **Neil Shea** had 19 goals and 20 assists in 36 games with Utah last season. **Reed Lebster** scored 19 goals and 27 assists in 67 games during the 2024-25 campaign. Lebster led Utah in scoring after February 1st (11 goals, 19 assists) in 32 games. He led Utah in scoring in both February (7 goals, 7 assists) and March (4 goals, 9 assists). **Luke Manning** had 18 goals and 21 assists during the 2024-25 campaign for Utah. Manning ended last season red hot as he scored 11 points (7 goals, 4 assists) in the last 8 games, including a 2-goal performance in the final game of the campaign on April 12, 2025 at Rapid City. **Griffin Ness** scored 3 goals and 7 assists in 14 games with Utah late in the season after being acquired in a trade with Toledo. **Adam Berg** returns for his third season with Utah. He scored 7 goals and 10 assists in 50 games with the Grizzlies last season. **Evan Friesen** is back in Utah for his first full professional season. Friesen led the WHL's Wenatchee Wild with 32 goals and 61 points during the 2024-25 season.

Defenseman **Garrett Pyke** split the 2024-25 season with the AHL's Colorado Eagles and the Grizzlies. In 19 games with Utah last season Pyke had 2 goals and 11 assists. Defenseman **Luc Salem** played in 2 games with Utah at the end of the 2024-25 season. Last year Salem split time with Indy and Kalamazoo.

New Grizzlies Forwards

Tyler Gratton led the Reading Royals with 20 goals during the 2024-25 season. **Ty Voit** scored 8 goals and 29 assists for Cincinnati last season. Voit was a 5th round pick by the Toronto Maple Leafs in the 2021 NHL draft. **John Gelatt** spent the past four seasons at Holy Cross College. **Maxim Barbashev** played with the AHL's Hartford Wolf Pack and ECHL's Bloomington Bison. **Danny Dzhaniyev** played at Penn State University for four seasons from 2021-2025, scoring 34 goals and 59 assists in 146 games. **Jack Ricketts** had 20 goals in 38 games with Quinnipiac College during the 2024-25 season. **Rilen Kovacevic** enters his rookie campaign after a stellar career in the WHL as he scored 128 points, 59 goals and 69 assists in 225 games.

Fresh Faces on the Grizzlies Blue Line

The Grizzlies have many new defensemen for the upcoming season. **Aiden Hansen-Bukata** played at Ohio State University last season and led his club with 29 assists. **Noah Ganske** was a +33 combined in his last two seasons with the Fort Wayne Komets. **Christian Felton** split time with the AHL's Abbotsford Canucks and ECHL's Kalamazoo Wings last season. **Avery Winslow** has 67 games of ECHL experience with Orlando and Wheeling. **Colby Enns** is in his first full season as a pro after spending a successful college career at Northern Michigan University and Merrimack College.

John Becanic is the New Utah Grizzlies Head Coach

John Becanic is the ninth head coach in team history.

Began coaching career in the early 90's as an assistant coach under future Jack Adams winner Ted Nolan, where together they won a Memorial Cup in 1993 with the Soo Greyhounds. Becanic led the 2003 Pittsburgh Force to a USA Hockey Junior A National Championship.

Becanic spent four years as the Associate Head Coach with the Everett Silvertips of the WHL serving under former NHL head coach, Kevin Constantine. In their first year as an expansion franchise, the Silvertips became the first and only CHL team to make it to the league finals in their first season. Promoted to Head Coach of the Silvertips in 2006 where he won 66 games in two seasons.

Becanic had additional stops in the WHL as an associate head coach in Seattle and Vancouver serving under former NHL and Grizzlies coach Don Hay. In total, John has coached over 60 NHL draft picks.

After stepping away from a year 30 coaching career, John founded Pyramid Hockey 2016. With a passion for helping players and mentoring coaches, Pyramid's primary focus was player/coach development through Hockey IQ.

In 2019, John founded and served as the CEO of The Prospect Exchange (TPE), a video and analytics platform. After acquiring ICEBERG Sports Analytics and growing TPE, John sold and stepped away from the company so that he could get back to working with players on the IQ side. In 2023 he partnered with Minnesota Advancement Program (MAP), and designed and implemented an online virtual IQ program for youth hockey in MN.

In January of 2024, John was offered the opportunity to get back behind the bench for the Idaho Falls Spud Kings, who won the 2024-25 Dineen Cup Championship in their second year of existence.

Ryan Anderson and Jack Skille Named Grizzlies Assistant Coaches

Anderson prepares for his 2nd season behind the bench as an Assistant Coach at the ECHL level. During the 2024-2025 season Anderson was the Assistant Coach of the Reading Royals. Anderson led the NAHL's Amarillo Wranglers to the 2024 playoffs.

Jack Skille has been named as the Utah Grizzlies assistant coach and director of skill development.

Skille was a first round draft pick, 7th overall by the Chicago Blackhawks in the 2005 NHL Entry Draft. He played at the University of Wisconsin from 2005-07, scoring 21 goals and 18 assists. He was part of Wisconsin's 2006 National Championship club.

He made his NHL debut with the Blackhawks vs Los Angeles on December 30, 2007. He scored his first pro goal and had 1 assist at Montreal on January 8, 2008.

Skille played in 368 NHL games over a ten season stretch from 2007-2017. He played for Chicago, Florida, Columbus, Colorado and Vancouver. He appeared in 6 games with the Blackhawks during their 2009-2010 Stanley Cup championship season.

Grizzlies Team Notes (2024-25)

Utah used 51 players last season. 16 different players scored their first pro goal during the 2024-25 season. Utah was 7-0 when scoring a shorthanded goal. Utah has a second period goal in 23 of their last 27 games. Utah was fourth in the league with 90 second period goals. Utah was 16-1-1-1 when leading after 2 periods. Utah was 13-9 on Saturdays this season. Utah was 23-2-2 when scoring 4 or more goals. 23 of their 25 wins have come when they have scored 4 or more. The Grizzlies were fifth on the power play at home this season (22.5 percent, 31 for 138).

Utah had 10 games of 2 or more power play goals. The Grizzlies were awarded three penalty shots in a 4-game stretch from February 11-17. Utah was 1 for 3 in penalty shots as Cole Gallant scored 18:55 into the second period vs Idaho on February 17.

Grizzlies History

The Grizzlies are celebrating their 31th season of professional hockey in the state of Utah. The Grizzlies played in the International Hockey League from 1995-2001. Utah won the 1996 Turner Cup as they were led by Head Coach Butch Goring, who was a four-time Stanley Cup champion as a player with the New York Islanders. Butch Goring had a record of 178-123-27 in four seasons with the Grizzlies. Bob Bourne was the Head Coach of the Grizzlies from 1999-2001. Bourne was a four-time Stanley Cup champion and the winner of the Masterton Trophy back in the 1986-87 season. The Grizzlies were 83-61-20 in Bourne's two seasons behind the bench.

The Grizzlies moved to the American Hockey League for four seasons from 2001-2005. The Grizz were sold to Dan Gilbert, who moved the team to Cleveland, and they are now known as the Cleveland Monsters. The Grizzlies bought an ECHL franchise and moved to Utah for the 2005-06 season. The Grizzlies have made the playoffs in 15 of the 18 seasons where a postseason was held (They were in line to make the playoffs before the 2019-2020 season was cancelled).
