Tonight's Matchup

It's the second of a two city, three games in three days series between the Grizzlies and Steelheads. Neil Shea has a goal in four of his last 5 games and a point in 5 of 6. Tyler Gratton has a point in 7 of his last 9 games. Stepan Timofeyev has 6 points (2 goals, 4 assists) in his last 6 games. It's the fourth of 7 meetings this season between the division rivals. It's the 245th regular season meeting all-time between Utah and Idaho. The Grizzlies have won 98 regular season games all-time vs Idaho.

Three Way Tie at the Top

Tyler Gratton (2g, 6a), Reed Lebster (5g, 3a) and Neil Shea (4g, 4a) are each tied for the club lead with 8 points. Gratton leads Utah with 6 assists. Lebster leads the Grizzlies with 5 goals. Shea leads the club with 3 power play goals.

Games This Week

Friday, November 14, 2025 – **Idaho 3 Utah 2 (Overtime)** - Utah got goals from Tyler Gratton and Stepan Timofeyev. Idaho's Mitch Wahl scored the tying goal with 55 seconds left in regulation and Jade Miller got the game winner shorthanded 54 seconds into overtime. Utah outshot Idaho 44 to 26. It was Utah's highest shot total in a game this season. Utah was 1 for 6 on the power play, Idaho was 1 for 2. Luke Manning had 1 assist and was a +1 for Utah.

Saturday, November 15, 2025 – Utah at Idaho. 7:10 pm. Idaho Central Arena. The 154th time these teams have met in Boise in either the preseason, regular season or postseason.

Sunday, November 16, 2025 – Utah at Idaho. 4:10 pm. Idaho Central Arena. Grizzlies final regular season appearance ever at Idaho Central Arena. It's the first time Utah has played at Idaho on a Sunday since November 5, 2006, a game Idaho won 4-1. That was just Utah's seventh game all-time at Idaho.

Who's Been Hot Lately for Utah

Danny Dzhaniev is fifth among league rookies with 34 shots on goal. He scored his first three professional goals on October 30 vs Jacksonville.

Tyler Gratton has a point in 7 of his last 9 games. Gratton leads Utah with 6 assists.

Aiden Hansen-Bukata has 5 assists in 8 games this season. He is tied for 3rd among league rookies with 3 power play assists.

Kyle Keyser earned a 29 save shutout in his Utah debut on November 7 at Wichita. It's his second career ECHL shutout. He has 3 AHL shutouts and 1 in the KHL.

Reed Lebster is tied for the club lead with 8 points (5g, 3a). Lebster has a 16.7 shooting %. Lebster has a point in 5 of his last 8 games (5g, 3a).

Neil Shea has a goal in 4 of his last 5 games. Shea is tied for the club lead with 8 points (4g, 4a). Shea leads Utah with 3 power play goals.

Stepan Timofeyev has 6 points (2g, 4a) in his last 6 games. Timofeyev scored a power play goal 8:27 into the third period on Nov. 14 vs Idaho.

Dylan Wells stopped all 46 Idaho shots on October 24. Wells is the first goaltender since Garrett Metcalf (October 19-22, 2023) to be named ECHL goaltender of the week.

Grizzlies Team Notes

Utah has scored 21 five on five goals and allowed 21 five on five goals this season. Utah has had four players score their first professional goals this season (Danny Dzhaniyev, Christian Felton, John Gelatt, Jack Ricketts). Utah's Penalty Kill is 30 for 35 (85.7%). Utah's team save % is .909. Utah has outscored opponents 17 to 14 on the road this season (6 games). Utah has had 60 hat tricks since the beginning of the 2006-07 season. Utah is outscoring opponents 11 to 7 in the second period and 11 to 10 in the third period. Utah is 4-0-2 when either leading or tied after 2 periods.

Kyle Keyser Earns a Shutout in Grizzlies Debut

Goaltender Kyle Keyser stopped all 29 Wichita shots in a Utah 2-0 victory on November 7. It was Keyser's sixth professional shutout. He has 3 shutouts in his time in the AHL including one this season with Colorado. He now has 2 ECHL shutouts and 1 in Russia during the 2024-25 season.

Keyser was reassigned to Utah from the AHL's Colorado Eagles on November 3rd.

In 76 career AHL games he has a record of 31-28-19 with a .903 save percentage and a 2.77 goals-against average. Keyser spent time from 2019-2024 with the AHL's Providence Bruins and the ECHL's Maine Mariners. In three games with Colorado this season he had a 2-1 record with a .937 save percentage and a 1.34 goals-against average.

Defenseman Connor Kelley Reassigned to Grizzlies

Defenseman Connor Kelley has been reassigned to the Utah Grizzlies from the AHL's Colorado Eagles.

Kelley was a 7th round draft pick (204th overall) by the Chicago Blackhawks in 2021. Kelley played for the U.S. National Under -17 and Under 18 teams from 2018-2020.

Kelley played at the University of Minnesota-Duluth for two seasons from 2020-2022, scoring 5 goals and 11 assists in 64 games. Kelley was part of the UMD Bulldogs 2021 Frozen Four club. Kelley transferred to Providence College, where he played for three seasons from 2022-2025. Kelley was positive in the plus/minus category in all five college seasons and had a combined +34 rating.

He appeared in 2 games with the Colorado Eagles this season and has 1 assist and a +1 rating. Kelley is from Maple Grove, Minnesota and has good size at 6'1" and 201 pounds. Kelley will wear number 74 for the Grizzlies.

Hunter Skinner Makes NHL Debut

2020-2021 Utah Grizzlies defenseman Hunter Skinner made his NHL debut with the St. Louis Blues on November 14th in a 6-5 shootout loss to the Philadelphia Flyers. Skinner played in 26 games with Utah, scoring 7 goals and 10 assists. Skinner is the second former Grizzlies defenseman to make his NHL debut as Charle-Edouard D'Astous has appeared in 9 games with the Tampa Bay Lightning and has 1 goal and 4 assists. Skinner is the second player from the 2020-21 Grizzlies squad to make it to the NHL as Hayden Hodgson has played in 8 games with Philadelphia and 3 games with Ottawa, including 2 this season. Trent Miner (2022-2024 Utah) has appeared in games with the Colorado Avalanche this season. Nate Clurman played in 1 game with the Pittsburgh Penguins during the 2024-25 season.

Hat Trick for Danny Dzhaniev

Utah's Danny Dzhaniev scored his first 3 professional goals in Utah's 6-4 victory over Jacksonville. Dzhaniev is a first year pro out of Penn State. The Brooklyn native scored 34 goals and 59 assists in four seasons at Penn State and he was part of Penn State's 2025 Frozen Four team.

It was Utah's second hat trick of the season. Reed Lebster scored three goals at Idaho on October 24. Last season Utah had only one hat trick and that was Neil Shea, who scored three goals vs Tahoe on December 21, 2024 in a 6-4 Utah win. Utah has had 60 hat tricks since the beginning of the 2006-07 season. Utah had 11 hat tricks in the 2007-08 campaign. The second most three goal games in the ECHL era is 6, which was set in the shortened 2019-20 season.

Reed Lebster's Big Weekend vs Idaho

Reed Lebster scored 3 goals and 1 assist in a Grizzlies 5-0 win at Idaho on October 24. It was Utah's first hat trick since Neil Shea scored three goals vs Tahoe on December 21, 2024. The four point effort for Lebster tied a career high as he scored 2 goals and 2 assists at Tulsa on March 1, 2025 in a game Utah won 8-3. Lebster added a power play goal on October 25 vs Idaho. Lebster had 19 goals and 27 assists for Utah in the 2024-25 season. He led Utah in scoring in February 2025 (7 goals, 7 assists) and March 2025 (4 goals, 9 assists).

Tyler Gratton Named Grizzlies Captain, Shea, Manning, Ganske and Berg to Wear "A's"

Tyler Gratton is the new Utah Grizzlies captain. Gratton scored his first goal in a Utah uniform in the first period of a 5-0 victory at Idaho on October 24. Gratton is in his second season as a professional. He scored 20 goals for the

Reading Royals in the 2024-25 campaign, which led the club. Gratton was the captain of the Arizona State University team in the 2023-24 season.

Luke Manning and Neil Shea have each had the “A’s” on their sweaters since October 24.

In Memory: Kevin Bruder (1968-2025)

Kevin Bruder, beloved General Manager of the Maverik Center, President & CEO of the Utah Grizzlies, and Chairman of the ECHL Board of Governors, passed away on May 11 at the age of 56, while enjoying the Utah outdoors. Kevin’s greatest joy was his family, and he is survived by Susan and their four beloved children: Allison, Emily, Joel, and Christopher.

Kevin and his family moved to Utah in 1997 as the Maverik Center—then known as The E-Center—prepared to open its doors and take the international stage as a host venue for ice hockey during the 2002 Winter Olympic Games. Named by the Elmore Sports Group as the arena’s first General Manager, Kevin went on to hold that role for nearly three decades, shaping the Maverik Center into a cornerstone of sports and entertainment in the region.

In 2005, Kevin was named President & CEO of the Utah Grizzlies, and in 2021, his peers throughout the league elected him Chairman of the ECHL Board of Governors—an honor that spoke to the high regard in which he was held across professional hockey.

A tireless advocate for the power of sports and community, Kevin gave generously of his time and talents, volunteering for organizations including Make-A-Wish Utah, Visit Salt Lake, TEAM Coalition, IAVM and dozens more over nearly 30 years. His commitment to civic engagement was matched only by his leadership within the Maverik Center and the Grizzlies organization.

Kevin Bruder’s legacy is one of leadership, generosity, and service. He leaves behind a community that was stronger because of him, and he will be deeply missed by all who had the privilege of knowing or working alongside him.

John Becanic is the New Utah Grizzlies Head Coach

John Becanic is the ninth head coach in team history.

Began coaching career in the early 90’s as an assistant coach under future Jack Adams winner Ted Nolan, where together they won a Memorial Cup in 1993 with the Soo Greyhounds. Becanic led the 2003 Pittsburgh Force to a USA Hockey Junior A National Championship.

Becanic spent four years as the Associate Head Coach with the Everett Silvertips of the WHL serving under former NHL head coach, Kevin Constantine. In their first year as an expansion franchise, the Silvertips became the first and only CHL team to make it to the league finals in their first season. Promoted to Head Coach of the Silvertips in 2006 where he won 66 games in two seasons.

Becanic had additional stops in the WHL as an associate head coach in Seattle and Vancouver serving under former NHL and Grizzlies coach Don Hay. In total, John has coached over 60 NHL draft picks.

After stepping away from a year 30 coaching career, John founded Pyramid Hockey 2016. With a passion for helping players and mentoring coaches, Pyramid’s primary focus was player/coach development through Hockey IQ.

In 2019, John founded and served as the CEO of The Prospect Exchange (TPE), a video and analytics platform. After acquiring ICEBERG Sports Analytics and growing TPE, John sold and stepped away from the company so that he could get back to working with players on the IQ side. In 2023 he partnered with Minnesota

Advancement Program (MAP), and designed and implemented an online virtual IQ program for youth hockey in MN.

In January of 2024, John was offered the opportunity to get back behind the bench for the Idaho Falls Spud Kings, who won the 2024-25 Dineen Cup Championship in their second year of existence.

Ryan Anderson and Jack Skille Named Grizzlies Assistant Coaches

Anderson prepares for his 2nd season behind the bench as an Assistant Coach at the ECHL level. During the 2024-2025 season Anderson was the Assistant Coach of the Reading Royals. Anderson led the NAHL's Amarillo Wranglers to the 2024 playoffs.

Jack Skille has been named as the Utah Grizzlies assistant coach and director of skill development.

Skille was a first round draft pick, 7th overall by the Chicago Blackhawks in the 2005 NHL Entry Draft. He played at the University of Wisconsin from 2005-07, scoring 21 goals and 18 assists. He was part of Wisconsin's 2006 National Championship club.

He made his NHL debut with the Blackhawks vs Los Angeles on December 30, 2007. He scored his first pro goal and had 1 assist at Montreal on January 8, 2008.

Skille played in 368 NHL games over a ten season stretch from 2007-2017. He played for Chicago, Florida, Columbus, Colorado and Vancouver. He appeared in 6 games with the Blackhawks during their 2009-2010 Stanley Cup championship season.

Grizzlies History

The Grizzlies are celebrating their 31th season of professional hockey in the state of Utah. The Grizzlies played in the International Hockey League from 1995-2001. Utah won the 1996 Turner Cup as they were led by Head Coach Butch Goring, who was a four-time Stanley Cup champion as a player with the New York Islanders. Butch Goring had a record of 178-123-27 in four seasons with the Grizzlies. Bob Bourne was the Head Coach of the Grizzlies from 1999-2001. Bourne was a four-time Stanley Cup champion and the winner of the Masterton Trophy back in the 1986-87 season. The Grizzlies were 83-61-20 in Bourne's two seasons behind the bench.

The Grizzlies moved to the American Hockey League for four seasons from 2001-2005. The Grizz were sold to Dan Gilbert, who moved the team to Cleveland, and they are now known as the Cleveland Monsters. The Grizzlies bought an ECHL franchise and moved to Utah for the 2005-06 season.
