It's the last meeting ever between the Grizzlies and Steelheads. Utah is 2-2-2 vs Idaho this season. Utah is 99-115-33 all-time vs Idaho in the regular season. Evan Friesen has 3 goals in his last 4 games. Luke Manning has 4 goals in his last 6 games. Danny Dzhaniyev has a point in 6 straight games and a point in 12 of his last 14. Utah has scored 18 goals in their last 4 games.

April 1, 2026 – **Wichita 3 Utah 6** – Aiden Hansen-Bukata, Cy LeClerc and Nicholas Niemo each had 1 goal and 1 assist. Dylan Gratton had 2 assists and was a +2. Mikey Colella and Evan Friesen each added a goal. Danny Dzhaniyev had 1 assist and led Utah with 4 shots on goal. Utah outshot Wichita 32 to 24. Grizzlies went 1 for 2 on the power play and 2 for 2 on the penalty kill.

April 3, 2026 – **Wichita 2 Utah 5** – Marek Hejduk scored 2 goals and 1 assist. Danny Dzhaniyev and Luc Salem each had 1 goal and 1 assist. Evan Friesen had 2 assists. The Rookies are Stepping Up

15 of the 20 players in Uniform for Utah on April 4th are first year pros. Many of them have stepped up and played good hockey. Five players in the last 4 games have scored their first professional goals. Marek Hejduk was the number 1 star on April 3rd as he scored 2 goals, 1 assist and was a +3. Danny Dzhaniyev, the favorite for the league's Rookie of the Year award, had 1 goal and 1 assist as he earned his 19th multiple point game of the season. Evan Friesen has had a solid rookie campaign. Friesen had 2 assists and was a +2 on April 3rd. Friesen has 23 goals and 19 assists on the season. Cy LeClerc had 1 goal and 1 assist and Nicholas Niemo and Ryan Rosborough each scored their first pro goals on April 1.

Danny Dzhaniev Named League Rookie of the Month for March 2026

SHREWSBURY, N.J. – Utah Grizzlies' forward Danny Dzhaniev has been named the [Howies Hockey Tape](#) ECHL Rookie of the Month for March. Dzhaniev scored six goals and added eight assists for 14 points in 11 games during the month.

The 23-year-old had at least one point in eight of his 11 games, while posting multiple points five times. He had three assists on March 7 at Cincinnati and notched his second hat trick of the season on March 15 against Tulsa. Dzhaniev was named ECHL Player of the Week for the week ending March 15 after recording seven points (6g-1a) in three games.

A native of Brooklyn, New York, Dzhaniev leads ECHL rookies with 44 assists and 68 points, which are tied for third and tied for second overall in the league respectively, while his 260 shots on goal are tied for the most in the league.

Prior to turning pro, Dzhaniev recorded 93 points (34g-59a) in 146 career games at Penn State University and 47 points (24g-23a) in 98 career games in the United States Hockey League with Dubuque and the U.S National Under-17 and Under 18 Teams.

It's the second straight month where a Grizzlies forward has won the ECHL Rookie of the Month award. Reilly Connor was the winner for February 2026. Dzhaniev is the ninth Grizzlies skater to win the league's Rookie of the Month award.

Team Notes

5 Grizzlies players have scored their first pro goals in the last 4 games (Marek Hejduk, Hank Kempf, Cy LeClerc, Nicholas Niemo, Ryan Rosborough). 18 Grizzlies skaters have scored their first pro goals this season. Utah has 18 goals in its last 4 games. Utah is 8th in the league with 3.26 goals per game. Utah is outscoring opponents 68 to 58 in the first periods. Utah has won 3 in a row for the first time since October 25-November 1, 2024. Utah went 17-15-3-1 on the road this season. Utah scored 127 goals on the road (3.52 goals per game). Utah went to 20 rounds of a shootout at Cincinnati on March 8. It was the longest shootout in team history and the fourth time in league history where a shootout has gone 20 or more rounds. The Grizzlies have used 60 players this season. Four players have appeared in all 68 games this season: Danny Dzhaniev, Evan Friesen, John Gelatt and Reed Lebster. 8 different Grizzlies goaltenders have registered a win this season. Utah has used 9 different goaltenders this season. Four different goaltenders have earned a shutout this season. It's the first time that's happened in Utah's ECHL era.

Grizzlies Have Had Many Players This Year

Hank Kempf became the 60th different player to appear in a game for Utah on April 4, 2026. Kempf scored a goal in his first shift for Utah, which was his first pro goal. Utah has used 32 forwards, 19 defensemen and 9 goaltenders. The team record for the most players used in a single season is 63, which was set in the 1996-97 season.

Luke Antonacci is a +5 in his last 9 games and is a +3 in 14 games with Utah. Antonacci has missed the last 3 games.

Mathieu Boislard made his Grizzlies debut on Jan. 16. He has 1 goal, 2 assists, 31 shots on goal and 62 PIM in 35 games with Utah. Boislard has been in 5 fights with Utah. Boislard scored his first ECHL goal on March 20.

Aiden Hansen-Bukata returned to the Grizzlies on March 25 after playing in 4 games with the AHL's Colorado Eagles, scoring 1 assist. Hansen-Bukata had 10 points (3g, 7a) in his last 10 games. AHB is 3rd on the club with 43 points and second with 37 assists. AHB has 21 power play points (2g, 19a).

Mikey Colella signed with Utah on January 15, 2026. Colella scored in his first pro game on Jan. 16 vs KC. Colella has 3 goals, 5 assists and 26 shots in 35 games this season.

Reilly Connors has 12 goals and 6 assists in his last 18 games. Connors has a point in 6 of his last 12 games. Connors was a +3 in 12 games in February. He had a point in 9 of 12 games in February, where he was named the league's Rookie of the Month. Connors returned to the lineup on April 3rd after missing 8 straight games.

Danny Dzhaniyev leads Utah with 19 multiple point games. Dzhaniyev is 2nd in the league with 269 shots on goal. Dzhaniyev leads all rookies in points (70) and assists (46). Dzhaniyev is 2nd among rookies with 23 power play points and is first among league rookies with 21 power play assists. The 6 point effort vs Tahoe on February 25 (1 goal, 5 assists) was tied for the highest point total in the league this season. The 5 assists are the most by any player in the league in a game this season. Dzhaniyev has 3 or more shots in 50 of 67 games. Dzhaniyev picked up 3 primary assists at Cincinnati on March 7 and 2 goals vs Tulsa on March 12. Danny has 3 hat tricks this season. He was named the league's Player of the Week for March 9-15, where he scored 6 goals and 1 assist. Dzhaniyev has a multiple point game in 5 of his last 13.

Colby Enns has 5 goals and 10 assists in 57 games this season. Enns scored the overtime game winner vs Wichita on April 4. Enns had his first multiple point game as a pro with 1 goal and 1 assist on April 4.

Evan Friesen has a goal in 10 of his last 26 games and 15 goals in his last 32 games. Friesen had 11 points (6g, 5a) in 12 games in February. Evan was the number 1 star with 2 goals and 1 assist at Cincinnati on March 7. Evan has 2 different 2 goal games (March 7 at Cincinnati, March 29 vs Allen). Tyler Gratton is second in the league with 10 power play goals. Gratton has 16 goals and 21 assists in 53 games. The captain scored the overtime game winner on Feb. 20 at Allen. Gratton suffered a lower body injury on March 14 and is out for the season.

Marek Hejduk made his pro debut on March 29 and he scored his first pro point with an assist on April 1. Hejduk was the number 1 star on April 3 as he scored 2 goals, 1 assist and was a +3.

Rilen Kovacevic returned to the Grizzlies lineup on March 20 for the first time since November 15, 2025. Kovacevic has played in 5 games this season.

Longest Shootouts in ECHL History

On March 8 in Cincinnati the Grizzlies fell in 20 rounds of a shootout in a 3-2 loss. It was the longest shootout in Grizzlies history. The longest shootout in ECHL history was 21 rounds, which has happened twice. It's the fourth time in league history where a shootout has gone 20 rounds or longer and the fifth time in NHL, AHL or ECHL history where a game has gone into the 20th round of a shootout.

Grizzlies Power Play

The Grizzlies are 24 for 102 on the power play over their last 32 games. Utah is 9th in the league on the power play at 20.6 percent (46 of 225). Tyler Gratto leads Utah with 10 power play goals and has 17 power play points (10g, 7a). Aiden Hansen-Bukata has 19 power play assists, which is 2nd among all league rookies and is 5th overall in the league. Danny Dzhaniev has 23 power play points (2g, 21a). Reed Lebster has 15 power play points (6g, 9a). Evan Friesen has 6 goals and 4 assists. Stepan Timofeyev has 3 goals and 3 assists.

Hank Kempf Reassigned to Utah from Colorado

Defenseman Hank Kempf was reassigned to the Utah Grizzlies from the AHL's Colorado Eagles.

Kempf was selected in the seventh round, 208th overall, by the New York Rangers in the 2021 NHL Draft. Kempf played at Cornell University for four seasons from 2021-2025, scoring 4 goals and 21 assists. Kempf was a combined +38 in four college seasons. Hank signed a two-year AHL contract with the Colorado Eagles on April 5, 2025. He appeared in 4 games with Colorado during the 2024-25 season and played in 2 games during the 2025 AHL Playoffs, scoring 1 assist. Kempf has played in 6 games with Colorado during the 2025-26 campaign, scoring 1 assist and a +1 rating.

Grizzlies End the Road Schedule With a Win

The Utah Grizzlies got a 3-1 victory in their final ever road game as they defeated the Indy Fuel on March 22, 2026. Utah played in 1159 regular season road games all-time, dating back to the start of the 1995-96 Grizzlies IHL season, where they won a Turner Cup. Utah's all-time regular season road record is 478-559-122.

Grizzlies Have a Shutout from Four Different Goaltenders

The Grizzlies have four shutouts this season and they have come from 3 different goaltenders. Dylan Wells earned a 46 save shutout on October 24 at Idaho. Kyle Keyser stopped all 29 Wichita shots on November 7. Kasimir Kaskisuo saved all 20 shots on December 13. Hunter Miska stopped all 32 Cincinnati shots in a 5-0 win on March 7. It's the second time in team history where they have gotten shutouts from four different goaltenders as Utah got 7 shutouts from 4 goalies during the 1999-2000 season.

Miska now has 5 North American pro shutouts in his career. Each of his previous 4 shutouts came in the American Hockey League.

Grizzlies in the NHL (Miner Earns First NHL Win, Shutout)

2020-2021 Utah Grizzlies defenseman Hunter Skinner made his NHL debut with the St. Louis Blues on November 14th in a 6-5 shootout loss to the Philadelphia Flyers. Skinner played in 26 games with Utah, scoring 7 goals and 10 assists. Skinner is the second former Grizzlies defenseman to make his NHL debut this season as Charle-Edouard D'Astous has appeared in 63 games with the Tampa Bay Lightning and has 5 goal and 23 assists. Skinner is the second player from the 2020-21 Grizzlies squad to make it to the NHL as Hayden Hodgson has played in 8 games with Philadelphia and 11 games with Ottawa, including 9 this season. Trent Miner (2022-2024 Utah) has appeared in 4 games with the Colorado Avalanche this season. Miner has a 1-0-3 record with a .933 save percentage and a 1.78 GAA. Miner got his first NHL win with a shutout vs Columbus on January 10, 2026. Miner is currently with the AHL's Colorado Eagles. Nate Clurman played in 1 game with the Pittsburgh Penguins in the 2024-25 season.

Three Hat Tricks for Danny Dzhaniev

Utah's Danny Dzhaniev scored his first 3 professional goals in Utah's 6-4 victory over Jacksonville on October 30. Dzhaniev recorded his second hat trick in a Utah uniform on December 21 at Tulsa. Danny had 3 goals, including the game winner with 10.5 seconds left in regulation as Utah defeated Tulsa 4-3 on March 15.

Dzhaniev is a first year pro out of Penn State. The Brooklyn native scored 34 goals and 59 assists in four seasons at Penn State and he was part of Penn State's 2025 Frozen Four team.

Danny is the third Grizzly in the ECHL era to have 3 separate hat tricks in a single season.

Reed Lebster scored three goals at Idaho on October 24. Last season Utah had only one hat trick and that was Neil Shea, who scored three goals vs Tahoe on December 21, 2024 in a 6-4 Utah win. Utah has had 61 hat tricks since the beginning of the 2006-07 season. Utah had 11 hat tricks in the 2007-08 campaign. The second most three goal games in the ECHL era is 6, which was set in the shortened 2019-20 season.

Danny Dzhaniyev Named Player of the Week

Danny Dzhaniyev was named the league's Player of the Week for March 9-15, 2026. Dzhaniyev scored six goals and added an assist for seven points in three games against Tulsa last week. The 23-year-old scored a pair of goals in a 7-1 win on Thursday, had a goal and an assist in a 4-3 overtime loss on Saturday and notched his third hat trick of the season in a 4-3 victory on Sunday. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Dzhaniyev leads ECHL rookies - and ranks second overall in the league - with 63 points (23g-40a) in 60 games this season. Prior to turning pro, Dzhaniyev recorded 93 points (34g-59a) in 146 career games at Penn State University and 47 points (24g-23a).

Dzhaniyev is the first Grizzlies player to be named Player of the Week since Neil Shea from Dec. 16-22, 2024. Ryan Kinasewich was named the league's player of the week 6 times over a 4 year stretch.

On September 9, 2025 the ECHL Board of Governors approved the Transfer of the Controlling Interest in the Utah Grizzlies' Membership from Grizzlies Hockey Club, LLC to Pro Hockey Partners, LLC, who will relocate the team to Trenton, NJ, at the conclusion of the 2025-26 season.

The team is committed to making this final season in Utah a memorable one, dedicated to the generations of fans who have supported the team through every high and low.

For 30 years, the Utah Grizzlies have been an integral part of the local sports landscape, creating countless moments of joy and excitement. The organization extends a heartfelt and profound thanks to the dedicated fans who have filled the stands, to the members of the booster club who have provided a sense of home to our players and coaches, and to the community partners who have supported the team through every season. Utah has a .524 winning percentage in their time in The ECHL. The Grizzlies reached the postseason in 15 of the 19 years in the ECHL era where a postseason was held.

In Memory: Kevin Bruder (1968-2025)

Kevin Bruder, beloved General Manager of the Maverik Center, President & CEO of the Utah Grizzlies, and Chairman of the ECHL Board of Governors, passed away on May 11 at the age of 56, while enjoying the Utah outdoors. Kevin's greatest joy was his family, and he is survived by Susan and their four beloved children: Allison, Emily, Joel, and Christopher.

Kevin and his family moved to Utah in 1997 as the Maverik Center, known as the E-Center—prepared to open its doors and take the international stage as a host venue for ice hockey during the 2002 Winter Olympic Games. Named by the Elmore Sports Group as the arena's first General Manager, Kevin went on to hold that role for nearly three decades, shaping the Maverik Center into a cornerstone of sports and entertainment in the region.

In 2005, Kevin was named President & CEO of the Utah Grizzlies, and in 2021, his peers throughout the league elected him Chairman of the ECHL Board of Governors—an honor that spoke to the high regard in which he was held across professional hockey.

A tireless advocate for the power of sports and community, Kevin gave generously of his time and talents, volunteering for organizations including Make-A-Wish Utah, Visit Salt Lake, TEAM Coalition, IAVM and dozens more over nearly 30 years. His commitment to civic engagement was matched only by his leadership within the Maverik Center and the Grizzlies organization.

Kevin Bruder's legacy is one of leadership, generosity, and service. He leaves behind a community that was stronger because of him, and he will be deeply missed by all who had the privilege of knowing or working alongside him.

John Becanic is the New Utah Grizzlies Head Coach

John Becanic is the ninth head coach in team history.

Began coaching career in the early 90's as an assistant coach under future Jack Adams winner Ted Nolan, where together they won a Memorial Cup in 1993 with the Soo Greyhounds. Becanic led the 2003 Pittsburgh Force to a USA Hockey Junior A National Championship.

Becanic spent four years as the Associate Head Coach with the Everett Silvertips of the WHL serving under former NHL head coach, Kevin Constantine. In their first year as an expansion franchise, the Silvertips became the first and only CHL team to make it to the league finals in their first season. Promoted to Head Coach of the Silvertips in 2006 where he won 66 games in two seasons.

Becanic had additional stops in the WHL as an associate head coach in Seattle and Vancouver serving under former NHL and Grizzlies coach Don Hay. In total, John has coached over 60 NHL draft picks.

After stepping away from a year 30 coaching career, John founded Pyramid Hockey 2016. With a passion for helping players and mentoring coaches, Pyramid's primary focus was player/coach development through Hockey IQ.

In 2019, John founded and served as the CEO of The Prospect Exchange (TPE), a video and analytics platform. After acquiring ICEBERG Sports Analytics and growing TPE, John sold and stepped away from the company so that he could get back to working with players on the IQ side. In 2023 he partnered with Minnesota Advancement Program (MAP), and designed and implemented an online virtual IQ program for youth hockey in MN.

In January of 2024, John was offered the opportunity to get back behind the bench for the Idaho Falls Spud Kings, who won the 2024-25 Dineen Cup Championship in their second year of existence.

Ryan Anderson and Jack Skille Named Grizzlies Assistant Coaches

Anderson prepares for his 2nd season behind the bench as an Assistant Coach at the ECHL level. During the 2024-2025 season Anderson was the Assistant Coach of the Reading Royals. Anderson led the NAHL's Amarillo Wranglers to the 2024 playoffs.

Jack Skille has been named as the Utah Grizzlies assistant coach and director of skill development.

Skille was a first round draft pick, 7th overall by the Chicago Blackhawks in the 2005 NHL Entry Draft. He played at the University of Wisconsin from 2005-07, scoring 21 goals and 18 assists. He was part of Wisconsin's 2006 National Championship club.

He made his NHL debut with the Blackhawks vs Los Angeles on December 30, 2007. He scored his first pro goal and had 1 assist at Montreal on January 8, 2008.

Skille played in 368 NHL games over a ten season stretch from 2007-2017. He played for Chicago, Florida, Columbus, Colorado and Vancouver. He appeared in 6 games with the Blackhawks during their 2009-2010 Stanley Cup championship season.

Grizzlies History

The Grizzlies are celebrating their 31st season of professional hockey in the state of Utah. The Grizzlies played in the International Hockey League from 1995-2001. Utah won the 1996 Turner Cup as they were led by Head Coach Butch Goring, who was a four-time Stanley Cup champion as a player with the New York Islanders. Butch Goring had a record of 178-123-27 in four seasons with the Grizzlies. Bob Bourne was the Head Coach of the Grizzlies from 1999-2001. Bourne was a four-time Stanley Cup champion and the winner of the Masterton Trophy back in the 1986-87 season. The Grizzlies were 83-61-20 in Bourne's two seasons behind the bench.

The Grizzlies moved to the American Hockey League for four seasons from 2001-2005. The Grizz were sold to Dan Gilbert, who moved the team to Cleveland, and they are now known as the Cleveland Monsters. The Grizzlies bought an ECHL franchise and moved to Utah for the 2005-06 season.

Former Grizzlies Defenseman Phil Pietroniro Played in Olympics for Team Italy

Former Utah Grizzlies defenseman Phil Pietroniro played in the 2026 Olympics for team Italy. Pietroniro played with Utah from 2015-2017, appearing in 125 games, scoring 5 goals and 32 assists. He also played in 13 playoff games for Utah, scoring 1 goal and 2 assists. Phil was a combined +2 for Utah.

Danny Dzhaniev Represented Utah in All Star Classic
